This was not a barrier as the Abbey, given to the Iona Cathedral Trust by the 8th Duke of Argyll George Campbell and his wife Elizabeth, had only one request: that worship be ecumenical. This was quite a progressive request for 1899.

Yet this is what Jesus asks of us. To be One. To Commune-as-One. To witness our similarities and our differences and learn how diverse God has created us to share unique gifts, beliefs, language and love with one another. (Read John 17:20-23)


At Cambridge Street we share this in so many ways! Inviting youth and young children to share in worship and empower and embrace programs, faith, inclusiveness and affirming for all.


